2010 HENRY G. FRIESEN INTERNATIONAL PRIZE IN HEALTH RESEARCH PROGRAM

The Friesen Prize Program was celebrated in Ottawa on September 29th-30th, 2010 honouring this year's Laureate Dr. Shirley M. Tilghman, President of Princeton University. Dr. Tilghman was introduced to dignitaries at a "Leaders' Breakfast" jointly hosted by FCIHR and the University of Manitoba. She was glowingly introduced by Dr. Reinhart Reithmeier, Board Member and Chair of Dept. of Biochemistry, University of Toronto. Opening Remarks and Welcoming Comments were provided by Dr. Diavir Jayas, VP Research, University of Manitoba. Dr. Tilghman then engaged in a lively discussion with the assembled crowd. Later that afternoon, she gave a Public Lecture at Tabaret Hall, University of Ottawa. She was welcomed by President and Vice Chancellor Allan Rock and introduced by Heather Munroe-Blum, Principal of McGill University. Dr. Tilghman discussed, "Science and Enterprise as a Social Good: The Role of Universities". That evening, an Award Dinner took place at Rideau Club. Dr. Tilghman's citation read: "For her outstanding leadership in genetic research, in science policy and education and advancing the role of women in science."

On September 30th, Dr. Tilghman spoke at a Luncheon of the Canadian Academy of Health

Sciences with US ambassador David Jacobson in attendance.

While in Ottawa, President Tilghman met with a number of senior advisory groups in government and had significant media exposure with CBC Radio and television, the Globe & Mail and others.

INSTITUTIONAL VISIT AT QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY

On September 30th and October 1st, Principal Daniel Woolf, Queen's University, sponsored Dr. Tilghman's visit to her Alma Mater. She spoke at a dinner of the Chemistry Innovation Council where a framed reprint of her first published research project under the guidance of Dr. Saul Wolfe and Dr. Albert Norris at the Dept. of was unveiled Chemistry in her honour. Chancellor David Dodge hosted a Leaders' Breakfast and introduced Dr. Tilghman to senior university notables and civic dignitaries including the mayor and chief of police. She spoke about the unique and significant contributions of Queen's University to the city and community. Dr. Tilghman spoke at a Public Forum on the issue of gender disparity: "Women in Science: Bridging the Gender Gap in Science and Technology." A fine luncheon at the Chancellor's residence concluded her formal duties. Before departing for home, Mr. Paul Kennedy of CBC Radio One "Ideas" recorded an interview that will be broadcast on CBC Radio mid January 2011.
