PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings all. This year-end report highlights an eventful 2016 for Friends of CIHR and for Science in Canada. We have experienced an abundance of positive signals from the Federal Government and various Ministers that Science broadly and Health Research, in particular, would undergo rejuvenation, as a priority undertaking in this Government's mandate. There is a consensus that young investigators in Canada have been disadvantaged by policies of funding agencies and that there is hope this would be addressed in the near future. Friends of CIHR organized a Roundtable to address this issue at the Canadian Science Policy Conference (CSPC) on November 8th, 2016 in Ottawa (see below).

Friends of CIHR organized **Sir Paul Nurse**'s 2015 Friesen Prize Institutional visits to Calgary and Edmonton on May 3rd-6th, 2016.

2016 FRIESEN PRIZE PROGRAM

Dr. Janet Rossant was awarded the 2016 Henry G. Friesen International Prize. She presented the Friesen Prize Lecture at U Ottawa on November 7th, 2016 entitled, "Stem Cell and Genome Editing: Ethical Challenges in Human Health". Dr. Rossant was introduced at the Leaders' Breakfast in the Parliamentary Dining Room that was co-hosted by Friends of CIHR and CHEO RI. Senator Jim Munson sponsored the venue and we are very grateful to his staff for facilitating this. Dr. Rossant also held forth at the OHRI Symposium on November 8th, 2016, chaired by Dr. Duncan Stewart, entitled,

"Regenerative Medicine as a Gateway to Translation and Innovation: Recent Advances and Moving Forward." That afternoon, Dr. Rossant also participated in the 2016 FCIHR Roundtable prior to a trip to McGill University to deliver the Friesen Lecture on November 9th, 2016, under the auspices of **Dr. Rose Goldstein**, Vice-Principal (Research and Innovation). Dr. Rossant spoke at the Faculty Club and the title of her presentation was: *"From embryos to stem cells to personalized medicine"*.


