2018 was replete with significant milestones in health research in Canada, starting with a substantial increase in the funding of Science. This was driven in part by the Federal government's vision of a knowledge-based economy and of the wide endorsement of Dr. David Naylor's Report on "Canada's Fundamental Science Review".

As well, insightful and effective leadership of CIHR with **Dr. Rod McInnes**, as Acting President, stabilized a fractured institution and set the stage for the appointment of our new President, Dr. Michael **Strong** (past Dean of Med, UWO), as of October 1st, 2018. Congratulations and thank you to Dr. Strong for taking on this vital responsibility, on behalf of Canada's health science community.

Our national program of Institutional visits by Friesen Laureates continues to reinforce the impact of Friends of CIHR. It affords the opportunity to promote our goals and purposes through a platform of convened gatherings of students, early career scientists, institutional leaders and policy makers at many centres across Canada. Dr. Alan Bernstein (2017 Friesen Prizewinner) criss-crossed the country giving Friesen Lectures, explaining the social and economic value of Science in Canada and AI as a priority focus of Federal support.


