PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Our annual gathering in Ottawa this past September 18th featured the 2013 Friesen Prizewinner **Dr. Harvey V. Fineberg**, who delivered a timely lecture entitled:

"The Power of an Idea to Bring Ideas to Power". As in previous years, we had overflow attendance and enthusiastic participation of clinician-scientist trainees, graduate students and many leaders of FCIHR and Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (CAHS).

Dr. Fineberg reviewed the history, methodology and impact of the Institute of Medicine on U.S. and global medicine, public health and policy. He gave a brilliant talk that was a model of clarity, focus and sophisticated messaging for a broad national audience.

On Sept. 19th, 2013, Dr. Fineberg's final offering was a Luncheon Address to the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences (CAHS). He spoke on, "America's Ambivalence about the Right to Health Care". Inspirational insights were highlighted and the timing was prescient, given President Obama's struggle for approval of his signature legislative piece, *The Affordable Care Act*.



2013 JOINT SYMPOSIUM OF CSCI-CITAC-FCIHR

FCIHR continues its productive collaboration with the Canadian Society for Clinical Investigation (CSCI) and its sister organization the Clinician Investigator Trainee Association of Canada (CITAC) in organizing a Joint Symposium for the 6th year. This collaboration is an integral part of the annual scientific meetings of these societies and precedes the Friesen Prize Public Forum. The 2013 Joint Symposium on Sept. 18th entitled, "Discovery Research is the Foundation of Innovation in the Health Sciences", focused on the primacy of fundamental research as the foundation of innovation and translational science. Three senior Canadian scientists made presentations that resonated well with the audience. Dr. Dan Drucker spoke on "Smart medicines from the gut for the treatment of diabetes and intestinal failure"; Dr. Heather Dean spoke on "Type 2 Diabetes in Children: Moving beyond Diet and Exercise" and Dr. John C. INSTITUTIONAL VISITS

The Friesen Prize Program at its inception provided for visits to centres and institutions outside of the principal Ottawa event and within 1 year of the Award Presentation.

In April 2013, Dr. Marc Tessier-Lavigne (2012 Friesen Prizewinner), President of the Rockefeller University, visited the University of Toronto and delivered the Inaugural Oliver Smithies Lecture entitled, "Brain Development and Plasticity: Molecular control of neuronal guidance and degeneration". Dr. Mary Hynes, his wife, attended as well and there was wide student and Faculty participation. He joined a student luncheon and also met privately with senior neuroscientists. An expanded Leaders' Breakfast was organized with a roundtable discussion on the funding of Research. Special guest Dr. Keith Yamamoto, Vice Chancellor for Research, and Executive Vice Dean, School of Medicine University of California, San Francisco, discussed, "Evolving Landscapes in Research Training of Health Scientists". The novel format proved entertaining and engaged the student audience. VIDEO HISTORY OF MEDICINE IN CANADA PROJECT

This project began over a decade ago and has now amassed a significant library of in-depth interviews of a number of Canada's Greats, who have contributed enormously to the growth and development of Bioscience in Canada over the past 50 years. This year, we interviewed three scholars at McGill University. In December 2013, the University of Manitoba will host a documentary team to

video interview the first of three of their scholars. These archival gems will be preserved in Robarts Library, University of Toronto, for future generations of historians, journalists and students. A number of clips have been posted on YouTube and there are more to come. Distinguished Emeritus Professor Michael Bliss, Canada's most noted Medical Historian, has been the principal interviewer and has done a remarkable job in exploring the lives and contributions of these medical giants.
