Dr. Lorraine Lipscombe is an accomplished physician scientist involved in health research, clinical care and education. Dr. Lipscombe leads a successful internationally recognized research program in diabetes epidemiology and health services, with a particular focus on the burden of diabetes in women. She has published over 100 peer-reviewed articles and led numerous research grants. She has also held many awards including a Diabetes Investigator award from Diabetes Canada, where she currently serves on the Board of Directors.

Dr. Lipscombe obtained her MDCM at McGill University in 1998. She continued her post-graduate studies in Internal Medicine, Endocrinology & Metabolism, and Clinical Epidemiology at the University of Toronto. Dr. Lipscombe is a popular Mentor having supervised many undergraduate and graduate students. Dr. Lipscombe's current research includes a major clinical trial to study the prevention of the development of Type 2 Diabetes in Women with Gestational Diabetes (GDM).

Dr. Lipscombe is the inaugural Director for University of Toronto's Novo Nordisk Network for Healthy Populations. This new network will unite academics with community stakeholders in Mississauga to address the burden of diabetes and other chronic diseases through community-based research.

As part of this Fall's Massey Grand Rounds Symposium, Dr. Lipscombe will give the 2022 Janet Rossant Lecture and participate in a panel discussion on aspects of the Diabetes epidemic.

* The Janet Rossant Lectureship was established in 2018 at Massey College in recognition of Dr. Rossant's distinguished career as a scientist, scholar, builder and mentor of young scientists.
